

Blatchford Score - Prognosis of Upper GI Bleeds

Using the assessments above, calculate the Blatchford Score.
Scores in the right column are added up for each component.
A score of 0 is the cut-off, with.

Consider early discharge for patients with a pre-endoscopy Blatchford score of 0
Any patient scoring >0, carry an increased risk, and may require endoscopic intervention
